oday's Annecy Animation Showcase, co-organised by the Marché du Film and Annecy Festival, is part of Animation Day 2025 in Cannes. The Showcase spotlights five exceptional animated worksin-progress from around the world. Sales agents, distributors and festival programmers are invited to discover the line-up and meet the creative teams behind the projects. The Showcase takes place from 10.00 at the Palais K.

The five works-in-progress are: Julián, by Louise Bagnall, in which Julián explores the magic of his Caribbean heritage, his friend Abuela's Brooklyn neighbourhood and his own assertion that he is really a mermaid; Sunny, by Michael Arias, about kids in a foster home in 1970s Tokyo who discover the Sunny, a broken down car that is both a clubhouse and an escape in which they can travel anywhere their imaginations take them; Ana, en passant, by Fernanda Alves Salgado, in which, after the death of her grandmother, Ana travels to Brazil and finds Alice, her double; Dante, by Linda Hambäck, in which crime suspect Helge, is forced to flee and ends up in the dump, where he meets Dante the rat; and $Mu\ Yi$ and the Handsome General, from Julien Chheng, following Mu Yi — who lives on a secluded mountain in China forbidden to men — as she embarks on a life-changing journey through old China, uncovering the secrets of love, courage and self-made destiny. A series of curated panels and networking opportunities follow the Showcase. From Streaming to the Big Screen: How Anime is Driving Cinema, is presented by Mitchel Berger, senior vicepresident, global commerce at Crunchyroll, who is discussing the global phenomenon of anime.

From Latvia to the Oscars: Behind The Global Success of Flow, examines the Golden Globe & Academy Award-winning animated film Flow, and its remarkable journey from a small independent Latvian studio to some of the biggest stages in world cinema.

Crossing Borders in Animation: Making International Co-Productions Work asks how animation co-productions come to life and succeed.

The day ends with a dedicated networking cocktail on the Unifrance Terrace, bringing animation filmmakers and enthusiasts together to connect and celebrate.

t Marché du Film 2025, our expanded conference line-up continues to spotlight the key forces shaping the global film industry. Covering topics from financing, distribution and co-production to streaming, innovation, and sustainability, our programme reflects today's major challenges and opportunities. We continue to place particular emphasis on innovation and AI, while staying committed to the fundamental values of meaningful film industry, with a strong focus this year on female leadership. Moreover, in the spirit of global openness and in collaboration with institutional and government partners, we proudly present over 15 country showcases — from Brazil to Europe, and from Nigeria to Hong Kong.

Belgian distribution and production company Belga Films Group is collaborating with French director Cédric Nicolas-Troyan on an Englishlanguage, live-action adaptation of the iconic European Blake and Mortimer graphic novels from the late comic book creator, writer and artist Edgar P. Jacobs. Titled The Yellow M. The cast includes Phil Dunster, Corey Mylchreest, and Emilia Schüle; international sales (handled by MSE) are launching in Cannes this week.

The Blake and Mortimer graphic novels have sold 20 million copies worldwide. The first story in the series, *The Secret of the Swordfish*, was published in 1946. So why almost 80 years from the genesis of the franchise to its first full-length feature?

I think there have been multiple attempts to do it, but these types of adaptations require big set pieces, a tremendous amount of visual effects and some serious stunts, so my un-educated guess is they probably faced budgetary and technological challenges more than anything else. Today we can do those things more easily and more convincingly, especially the VFX. One way or another, it ought to be made, whether it's by me or someone else.

Do you feel a responsibility to be at the helm of this project? There are,

after all, 20 million fans waiting to see how you handle the stories.

Yes, of course. You cannot start such an endeavour and not feel a responsibility. But fans are fans; they have expectations and yes, I am hoping to meet them. But those fans' expectations rarely have any constraints. Fans' expectations aren't concerned with schedules or budgets; every actor on each fan's dream cast list is always available and happy to sign up. Sadly, this is not how movies are made, and I know I will encounter strong reactions on every decision I make... but ultimately, as the director, all I can do is respect and be truthful to the original material and try my absolute best to bring something interesting on screen in hope it will resonate with the audience.

The film is shooting mostly in the UK and Belgium. What proportion is on location?

I always favour locations. I might come from a VFX background, but as a director, a blue screen is something I have very little interest in. Blue or green screen aside, there are always some sets that can only be built on stages. I'd say, for this film we are probably looking at a 60/40 location vs. stage ratio.

What is the international appeal of these stories?

There are very few things that universally translate and touch everyone, but laughter, adventure and certainly romance are the biggest themes that do travel, in my opinion. When you cook up a story made with friendship, mystery, danger, twists and fun, and you give this story some strong themes and undertones, you end up having something with a bigger reach. I just added romance to the source material.

Is there scope for a series of Blake and Mortimer films? Is there a sequel planned?

Yes, there is, which is partly why we decided to have younger cast — we pick up the story of Blake & Mortimer: The Yellow M at its origin in 1941, when the characters are younger. But the other main reason is so we could potentially grow with them through multiple films. There are so many stories to be told under the Blake & Mortimer banner, so making more than one was obviously always part of the conversation.

Connolly teams with Long and Hirsch for horror throwback *Lice*

ctionPark Productions announced its feature film debut yesterday with the horror film Lice, starring Emile Hirsch, Justin Long and company co-founder Kevin Connolly. The announcement was made during the Marché du Film at the Cannes Film Festival. The film, described as a gruesome throwback to 80s high-school classics, began production this week in Canada. Highland Film Group is handling international sales at the festival. Lice follows a deadly outbreak of the parasites at a Long Island high school in the 1980s. When the school is placed under military lockdown, itch-crazed students turn on each other in a desperate struggle to survive. Hirsch, known for Into the Wild and Once Upon a Time in Hollywood, stars as burned-out science teacher Mr. Shanker. Long, recently seen in Barbarian and Goosebumps, plays Principal Van, while Entourage star Connolly portrays Detective Sikorski, a police officer racing to contain the outbreak. First-time feature director Jonathan Bensimon described the script as "a real page-turner" that has been developed into "a pulpy horror feature with a cast that deftly mixes darkness and levity to create something truly unique." The film's concept has been likened to a horror mashup of The Breakfast Club and Lord of the Flies. Producer Jeremy Alter called the project "stylish, visually arresting and hilariously disturbing," while Highland Film Group CEO Arianne Fraser noted that the film "strikes a balanced blend of gut-wrenching terror and dark humour". French Toast Films is handling local production services in Canada.

The Riviera retreat: a film festival reporter's haven

s the Film Festival machine whirs into action along the Croisette, a select cadre of industry veterans knows that the true art of covering Cannes lies not in the screening schedule but in choosing the right pillow upon which to rest one's head. The Majestic and Martinez hotels stand as twin sentinels of luxury at opposite ends of the famed Croisette and both have undergone extensive renovations. At the Majestic, the legendary Deauville restaurant Ciro's has recently taken up residence on the beach, offering gourmet food in a chilled beach-side setting. The hotel's Spa Diane Barrière provides signature treatments in a central Cannes getaway.

"After 16 hours of back-to-back screenings, there's nothing quite like returning to crisp Egyptian cotton sheets after a hammam session and truffle-infused dinner," confides a veteran film critic who has covered the festival for three decades.

The Hotel Martinez counters with chef Jean Imbert's La Palme d'Or, where artistic plate presentations mirror the creativity celebrated in the festival's films. The Martinez's L'Oasis Beauty Spa sits alongside its new gym and pool in a secluded garden.

For those seeking complete respite from Cannes' intensity, a 30-minute train journey to Nice reveals the boutique elegance of Maison Albar – Le Victoria. This new five-star gem offers

handcrafted bedding that cradles weary bodies, while its rooftop restaurant Taulissa offers some of the most stand out food on the French Riviera and a great view. The basement spa, carved from ancient stone, offers a fabulous pool and

jacuzzi and even includes a €350 gold facial.

"The paradox of festival reporting is that your writing improves in direct proportion to your sleep quality," explains a producerturned-journalist. "I've found that alternating between Cannes' grandeur and Nice's more relaxed



sophistication provides both perspective and rejuvenation." Festival veterans agree: while the films may be the stars of Cannes, the unsung heroes are the luxurious sanctuaries that nourish both body and spirit, preparing one for another day of cinematic celebration. LIZA FOREMAN

With the 29th edition of The American French Film Festival (TAFFF) set to take place from October 28 to November 2, Cannes Market News asked the festival's organisers about the TAFFF's DNA and why it is a must for French TV and film production in the USA.

How is the 29th edition of The **American French Film Festival** shaping up?

François Truffart: Scheduled at the beginning of the Awards Season, with an audience mainly made up of members of the industry, the festival and its competitions have become a centerpiece for the promotion of French films and series in the US. To complete the programme, we follow annual events like Berlin, Cannes or Venice and work closely with all sales companies, US distributors and platforms, to offer the best selection at the Directors Guild in October. We also continue to develop the TAFFF Awards and the ceremony that will take place in France just after the festival.

Anouchka van Riel: The American French Film Festival looks toward 2025 with ambitious momentum, building on last year's landmark edition where we elevated our awards to new prominence: Jacques Audiard received our prestigious FACF Achievement Award, while distributor Richard Lorber was recognised with our Impact Award for his tireless work in bringing foreign films to US audiences. Building on these meaningful recognitions, we look forward to continuing this tradition in 2025 by honouring more filmmakers and industry leaders who connect French and American cinema through their work. We're also expanding our industry programmes, using last year's successful workshops as

our foundation. While the specific topics will depend on our final line-up, we're excited about the possibilities, especially with the ongoing support and expertise of our WGA and DGA board members.

In 2024, we hosted the phenomenal Adapting Stories to the Screen: From Words to Worlds panel in partnership with the Writers Guild of America (WGA) and UniFrance, exploring the creative alchemy of literary adaptations. The festival's bookends — Emilia Pérez and The Count of Monte Cristo — framed a dynamic conversation spanning completed works and projects in production at the time, like In Waves. Producer Priscilla Bertin and surfer/illustrator AJ Dungo joined WGA member David S. Goyer (The Dark Knight Trilogy, The Sandman) for a masterclass on transposing source material to film, with producer Ted Hope (21 Grams, Cassandro) delivering closing insights.

We also premiered A Director's Vision for Streaming Series, a high-profile Directors Guild of America (DGA) discussion featuring their president, Emmy-winning director Lesli Linka Glatter (Homeland), who helmed Netflix's political thriller Zero Day, and Oscar winner Steven Zaillian (Schindler's List), who directed every episode of Netflix's critically acclaimed Ripley. Their candid dialogue on crafting cinematic narratives for streaming platforms offered a masterclass in authorship in the digital age — a conversation we're eager to expand in 2025.

How does the American French Film Festival serve as an essential









platform for French productions in the Oscar race?

Cécile Rap-Veber: The American French Film Festival is becoming increasingly important for the French industry in the Oscar's race, primarily because it takes place at the beginning of the Awards Season. This makes TAFFF an essential launch pad and a key element in the global marketing strategy of sales companies, American distributors, and digital platforms. TAFFF is the place where your film needs to be seen, as it brings together many American professionals, including members of American guilds — since TAFFF is organised by the French American Cultural Fund, of which the Guilds are members. This is where you can meet American filmmakers and Academy Award voters. And it takes place in the heart of a legendary location, the DGA on Sunset Boulevard It also offers a glimpse of audience reactions to the films, which is a good indicator. Additionally, being selected for the American French Film Festival is a mark of quality for your film, as the festival showcases the 'crème de la crème' of French cinema and television programmes.

How do you maintain engagement with the festival year-round, beyond the main

François Truffart: The festival is committed to support American distributors and platforms by offering a visible platform for the promotion of their films and series in Hollywood and in the US. This commitment continues year-round through social media and the TAFFF Library, a unique guide to keep American audiences informed about

Created and produced by the Franco-American Cultural Fund, a unique partnership between the French Authors, Composers and Publishers' Society (SACEM) and the two American guilds, the Directors Guild of America (DGA) and the Writers Guild of America West (WGAW), joined by the Motion Picture Association (MPA), The American French Film Festival will take place at the Directors Guild of America in Hollywood from October 28 to November 2, 2025.

The festival's competition kicks off the Awards Season in Hollywood with red-carpet French-film premieres and has become a mainstay cultural event in the US.

This festival is one of the few places in the US where audiences and industry professionals can discover the depth and diversity of French cinema — often before the films are nominated for Best International Feature Film at the Oscars or recognised in other major awards. It's not just a showcase; it's a meeting place where ideas and artistic traditions cross-pollinate, enriching both communities.

s the 2025 Cannes Film Festival kicks into high gear, the American Pavilion stands once again as the epicentre of US film industry activity on the Croisette, offering a packed schedule of high-profile conversations and industry panels that promise to draw crowds from across the global film community.

Now in its 36th year, the American Pavilion—affectionately known as AmPav — continues its tradition as the essential gathering spot for filmmakers, executives and cinephiles seeking both professional opportunities and momentary respite from the festival's whirlwind pace.

"The American Pavilion is a full-service business and entertainment venue in a relaxed seaside environment, only steps away from the Palais," says Julie Sisk, president of The American Pavilion. "For over 30 years, The Pavilion has served as the hospitality centre for the American presence in Cannes and the host to journalists, filmmakers, actors and industry professionals from all over the world." 


